About us





ARTIST ROOMS Richard Long *Being in the Moment* 22 February - 23 May 2020

ARTIST ROOMS Richard Long *Being in the Moment* brings the work of renowned British sculptor, Richard Long, to Thelma Hulbert Gallery in East Devon.

Born in Bristol in 1945, Long is recognised as one of the most influential artists of our time. Awarded the Turner Prize in 1989, his practice is a unique investigation into landscape through the act of walking, encompassing photography, sculpture, text, drawings, maps, and diagrams.

Being in the Moment draws from the ARTIST ROOMS collection, jointly owned by the National Galleries of Scotland and Tate, and spans 40 years of Long's career, documenting his solo walks through

remote regions all over the world, from Ecuador to Devon.

The ARTIST ROOMS touring programme is delivered in partnership with Ferens Arts Gallery through 2020, supported using public funding by the National Lottery through Arts Council England, by Art Fund, and by the National Lottery through Creative Scotland.

Mike Perry Land/Sea 6 June - 5 September 2020

Mike Perry's work engages with significant and pressing environmental issues, in particular the tension between human activity and interventions in the natural environment, and the fragility of the planet's ecosystems (be that marine or land).

Land/Sea brings together two recent bodies of work, *Wet Deserts* and *Môr Plastig*. *Wet Deserts* investigates the impact of man on often over-looked locations such as National Parks and areas of natural beauty.



Môr Plastig (Welsh for 'plastic sea'), is an ongoing body of work that classifies and records objects washed up by the sea in intriguing detail.

Two key works from the exhibition will be also on display in the Forum building at University of Exeter, Streatham Rd Campus. **April 24 - July 9**
