Through a programme of exhibitions, projects, workshops and events, we will explore change in natural landscapes and land use, revealing a multitude of stories and connections which cut through time, challenging our perception and posing environmental and social questions.

Create Our Space (COS) COS provides ongoing opportunities for schools, emerging artists and young people 0 - 25 years and is generously supported by Arts Council England.

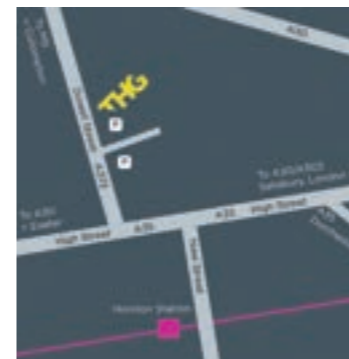

25 May – 6 July 2024

Sharon James #artistmother

Exhibition of new work by THG OPEN 2023 winner: Sharon James featuring large, strongly figurative paintings presenting vibrant scenes of domestic family life. They are broadly relatable to many people's experiences but offer more than a window on the world. They are intimate moments, inviting the viewer to become part of it like we are one of the family.

Each painting is often an accurate reflection of a keenly observed moment. They focus on the bits of life that so easily get covered over offering an intensely personal vision with echoes of family, motherhood and heritage.

seam collective: A Visible Thread

20 July – 31 August 2024

This exhibition by the contemporary textile collective **seam** explores the visibility and invisibility of thread. Thread, as cloth, is woven through our lives. It surrounds us like a second skin. Precisely because of these close connections, it becomes almost invisible to us.

A Visible THREAD aims to encourage viewers to rethink their relationship to thread, be aware of its materiality, its sustainability, its possibilities, and its limitations. Through a diverse range of textile disciplines and perspectives, this exhibition brings work from 15 **seam** artists together to stimulate thought, connection, and conversation.

Philippa Lawrence: A Space Between

14 September – 2 November 2024

A solo exhibition of the work of artist Philippa Lawrence drawing together threads that run throughout her practice. Showcasing early, new and developing works it also includes a creative response, in cut vinyl, to the life and work of artist Thelma Hulbert.

Philippa Lawrence is an artist based at Spike Island, Bristol and Principal Lecturer at Cardiff School of Art & Design. Philippa works on commissions, exhibitions and projects, nationally and internationally.

Anne Jackson: The Witchcraft Series

14 September – 2 November 2024

Upstairs Gallery: The Witchcraft Series explores the history of witch trials and the power of 'the witch' in our culture, both as metaphor for our fears, and as representation of social injustice towards women.

The tapestries often depict the trials of specific historic "witches" from the West Country, especially Somerset and Devon.

Anne Jackson uses historical texts and original illustrations, along with contemporary scientific and cultural references. Her medium, a textile art form called knotted tapestry, creates vivid, intensely-coloured imagery.
